Directions to the Venues

Monroe High School: I-405 north of US-101 to Nordhoff Street exit. Go west on Nordhoff to Haskell Avenue, turn north (right) on Haskell. Monroe High School will be on the left. Enter the first driveway and the gym is directly at the end of the driveway.

Mission Bay High School: Take I-5 South (south of the intersection of I-5 and I-805) to the Balboa Ave./Garnet Ave. exit, which is the first exit south of SR-52. This exit is also labeled Mission Bay Dr. Proceed south on Mission Bay Dr. You will need to stay in the middle lane as the two lanes on the left will be left turn only at Balboa Ave. and the two right lanes will be right turn only lanes at that intersection. Continue south on Mission Bay Dr. to the cutoff to Grand Ave., which is just past Rubio's Fish Tacos and a Shell station. Going west on Grand Ave. there will be a recreation center then Mission Bay High School on the left. At the first signal light as you pass Mission Bay High School, turn left, and go to the back of the school. There is a turnout in front of the gym and parking is on the dirt behind the gym or in the lot to the west just as you make the left turn. **Please do not park on the pavement near the back door of the gym.**

Palos Verdes Peninsula High School: From the North, head south on the San Diego Freeway (405). Exit at Hawthorne Boulevard and continue south (right turn onto Hawthorne Blvd.) approximately 7 miles. Turn right at Silver Spur Road. The school will be on your right. The parking lot is at the first light and the gym is adjacent to the lot.

From the South, take the San Diego Freeway (405) north to Hawthorne Boulevard. Turn left (south) from the exit ramp. Continue south approximately 7 miles. Turn right at Silver Spur Road. The school will be on your right. The parking lot is at the first light and the gym is adjacent to the lot.

From the East, take the 91 Freeway west to the 110 Harbor Freeway south. That interchange will allow you to transfer to the 405 San Diego Freeway north. Exit the 405 at Hawthorne Boulevard. Turn left (south) from the exit ramp. Continue south approximately 7 miles. Turn right at Silver Spur Road. The school will be on your right. The parking lot is at the first light and the gym is adjacent to the lot.

Entry Information

Individuals from Southern California, Tijuana, Arizona and Nevada are welcomed to enter the individual competitions. **Individual entry fees are \$5**, payable in cash only. Individuals are identified by the school they attend (or home-schooled), not the club where they train for fencing. Individuals are limited to entering only one level (middle school or high school) at each tournament. Once a fencer elects to compete at a higher level, he/she fences at that level for the season. Everyone who enters the competition receives a certificate of participation at the end of the League's season. The top eight finishers based on the two individual tournaments receive medals.

The team competition is limited to teams from schools or recognized geographic proximities in the greater Southern California area. Team fees are determined on a school basis. Trophies are given to the top three teams in the competition. Contact Ted Katzoff, League Treasurer, for more information.
